The "Constitutional" Roots of the possible European Civil Code,

Salvatore Mancuso is Assistant Professor of Comparative Law and International Business Law at the University of Macao, where he also lectured Gaming Law in the a.y 2004-2005 is leading a research project on Macao Gaming Law whose outcome will be a handbook on such topic, and a project related to legal aspects of Chinese investments in Africa. He is also Associate Researcher at the *Centre d'Etudes Français sur la Chine contemporaine* (CEFC) in Hong Kong. He got his Bachelor of Law at the University of Palermo (Italy) and has obtained its Ph.D. in Comparative Law in the University of Trieste (Italy). He has been a lecturer at the Universities of Trento, Asmara, Shanghai, Palermo, Salerno and Trieste, and has published a book several articles on Comparative and Environmental Law.

OUTLINE

The seminar intends to make the point on the actual debate about a possible European Civil code and to verify the possibilities of going ahead with this project with regard to the actual debate of "constitutional" law in Europe.

An introduction to the background of the idea of a European civil code will be followed by the analysis of the project currently ongoing in Europe and referred to the idea.

Then an overview of the actual status of the harmonizations of law related to matters that could be covered in the ambit of a possible Civil code will serve as the basis to consider the further developments on the same matters and other possible grounds of harmonization.

The seminar will then deal with the "constitutional" grounds of a possible European Civil Code.
