

- **ENGL020 Basic English I**
 This course will provide students with an introduction to English by presenting grammar, vocabulary, and reading skills at a foundational level. ENGL020 is designed to serve the needs of students enrolled in some special majors where English is not the medium of instruction.
Prerequisite: None
- **ENGL021 Basic English II**
 The course will continue to provide the foundational work in English begun in ENGL020 in the areas of grammar, vocabulary, and reading. In addition, ENGL021 will assist students in developing the productive language skills of writing and speaking as determined by the needs of their major.
Prerequisite: ENGL020
- **ENGL022/023 Practical English 1A: Basic Skills I & II**
 An intensive course for students who satisfy the University entrance requirement in English but who need extra work in this subject during their first year. The course will meet in four sessions per week. Language laboratory work will be required in addition to class sessions. The course will emphasize balanced development of ability in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, and will provide an introduction to essential study skills. Students who successfully complete this class will be taken to have reached the same level in English as those completing ENGL150/151.
Prerequisite: None
- **ENGL150/151 Practical English 1: Interaction and Study Skills I & II**
 This course is designed to foster a firm foundation in the knowledge and use of the English language. The course provides ample opportunities for the development of usage, vocabulary, reading, writing and related study skills. There is a weekly language laboratory session where students learn to improve their oral and listening abilities. The coursework includes both interactive class activities and discussions as well as take-home writing practice. Students who successfully complete this course are expected to be able to express themselves clearly in oral and written English.
Prerequisite: None
- **ENGL190/191 English I & English II**
 An upper-intermediate level course in English for special purposes designed for engineering majors. This course includes the use of technical and semi-technical vocabulary in making statements, descriptions, definitions, classifications, exemplifications and instructions. Listening and speaking skills include listening comprehension of technical passages, discussions of general and technical topics, and presentation of reports. Students will learn effective reading skills to analyze technical articles and will write short pieces using technical terms. Various aspects of grammar are integrated into the course. Other topics include laboratory report writing, including graphics, as group or individual projects.
Prerequisite: None
- **ENGL282 Public Communication Skill**
 This course focuses on speaking and writing skills. Students will practice formal presentations, participate in and lead small group discussions, and practice writing tasks based on readings and discussions that focus on the gaming industry. The speaking activities will focus on pronunciation, vocabulary, and organization of formal spoken discourse. The writing tasks will include short and longer discourse types that exemplify written communication in the gaming industry.
Pre-requisite: None
- **ENGL284 English Gaming Industry and Economy**
 This course builds on the skills taught in the first year English requirement courses. A variety of integrated language tasks and the use of professional texts and documents from the gaming industry will provide the context for the development and acquisition of English language vocabulary, speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills. The extensive practice of selected language functions, vocabulary, and oral and written communication forms of the gaming industry will be central to the course.
Pre-requisite: None
- **ENGL290 Focused English Skills: Speaking**
 A practical course to improve students' pronunciation and other skills required in spoken discourse of different types. Students will be provided with an atmosphere and a learning

experience designed to increase their confidence and skill as English speakers.
Prerequisite: ENGL292/293 or permission of instructor

- **ENGL291 Focused English Skills: Public Speaking**
A course that emphasizes elements of both verbal and non-verbal communication in public settings. The course will help students develop confidence in speaking and effective oral presentation skills.
Prerequisite: ENGL292/293 or permission of instructor
- **ENGL292/293 Practical English 2: Developmental I & II**
A course that expands and extends the skills developed in ENGL150/151. A variety of integrated oral tasks, written work and reading texts provide students with a challenging environment in which to improve their language skills. Study skills are taught where appropriate. The course includes language laboratory work.
Prerequisite: ENGL150/151 or release from ENGL150/151 based on admission exam results
- **ENGL294 Effective Writing with Computers**
The course focuses on writing techniques such as planning and drafting that are facilitated by the use of a word processor. Word processing skills will be developed in order that the student will be able to use the word processor as a truly effective writing tool.
Prerequisite: ENGL150/151 or permission of instructor
- **ENGL310/311 Practical English 3: Advanced I & II**
An advanced course in the use of oral and written English. Spoken and written materials will help develop facility and accuracy in comprehension, speaking and writing.
Pre-requisite: ENGL292/293 Practical English II: Developmental I & II
- **ENGL312/313 Focused English Skills: Writing I & II**
A course that offers intensive work and instruction in writing skills. Students learn to invent, select, organize and express their ideas clearly, precisely and fluently. Coursework covers a wide range of practice from reviews of sentence structure and the development of paragraphs to writing of essays for specific goals. By the end of the course, students are expected to have acquired the confidence and techniques to write academic papers.
Pre-requisites: ENGL292/293 Practical English II: Developmental I & II or permission of instructor
- **ENGL315 Focused English Skills - Listening**
A course intended to increase listening comprehension. Class materials will introduce the challenges to non-native speakers posed by such features of spoken English as informal and formal style, conversational and public speech, dialects and accents, etc.
Pre-requisite: ENGL292/293 Practical English II: Developmental I & II or permission of instructor
- **ENGL318/319 Oral Communication I & II**
These advanced courses seek to expand and develop the student's ability to communicate orally in a wide variety of roles and settings, and for a wide variety of purposes. They are essentially concerned with skill improvement and are practically based.
Pre-requisite: ENGL206/233 or permission of instructor
- **ENGL410/411 Practical English 4: Fluency I & II**
An advanced course in the use of English. The course will help students develop increased awareness of such features of the language as idiom, inference and appropriateness. Students who successfully complete the course will have reached a level of fluency enabling them to move easily and with confidence in all English-language settings.
Pre-requisite: ENGL310/311 or permission of instructor
- **ENGL412/413 Focused English Skills: Reading I & II**
An advanced course in the reading of contemporary texts from a variety of sources, largely of a non-literary kind. Frequent writing assignments will encourage students to respond personally and critically to the works studied.
Pre-requisite: ENGL292/293 Practical English II: Developmental I & II or permission of instructor
