### Mr. Li Daoyu

Mr. LI Daoyu is the President of the China International Public Relations Association (CIPRA), a national organization aimed at international cooperation in the field of public relations. Mr. LI served as Assistant Minister of Foreign Affairs from May 1988 to June 1990 and Ambassador (vice-ministerial level) of China.

Mr. LI joined the revolutionary work in 1948. He entered the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) in 1952 as a staff member and then the Deputy Director of the Department of International Organizations and Conferences. Mr. LI was appointed as the Director (from September of 1980 to February of 1981) and then the Deputy Director General (from February 1981 to January of 1983) of the Department of International Organizations and Conferences. In January of 1983, he became the Deputy Permanent Representative to the United Nations Office at Geneva and served there until November of 1984. From December of 1984 to May of 1988, Mr. LI was the Director General of the Department of International Organizations and Conferences. Then from May of 1988 to June of 1990, he was the Assistant Minister of Foreign Affairs and a member of CPC MFA Committee. Mr. LI became the Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the United Nations from June of 1990 until March of 1993. From April of 1993 to February of 1992, Mr. LI was the Ambassador to the United States. From March of 1998, he was the Elected Deputy to the Ninth National People's Congress (NPC) and Vice Chairman of the Overseas Chinese Affairs Committee of the NPC Standing Committee until his retirement in January of 2004.



### Madam LI Xiaolin

Madam LI Xiaolin is the Vice President of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries (CPAFFC), a national people's organisation engaged in promoting friendship, international cooperation, world peace and development.

Since joining CPAFFC in 1975, Madam LI has planned and organized many international conferences with wide-ranging themes on sister-cities, environmental culture, education, economy and trade. With a pioneering spirit, Madam LI has launched and helped to finance many poverty relief projects, including the project to support the poor and disabled students to finish school, the vocational training programme for laid-off women workers, the English teachers training courses for China's poverty-stricken areas, sand control and water resource management projects.

Madam LI graduated with a BA degree in English language and literature from Wuhan University in 1975. From 1982 to 1983 she studied at the University of California in Los Angeles and graduated with an MA in Asian American Studies.
